DICICCO SEEKS TO SILENCE MOTORCYCLES

September 24, 2008

PHILADELPHIA – Responding to constituent complaints, Councilman Frank DiCicco will introduce legislation to address noisy motorcycles at tomorrow's Council session.

The legislation will ban certain aftermarket muffler systems that are installed to make motorcycles loud. Fines for operating a motorcycle with an illegal system will be \$1500.

"These guys think its ok to rev their engines, roar down the street and disturb our neighborhoods," DiCicco said. "They have no thought for the people around them."

In addition, the legislation will make it illegal for any individual or business to install such muffler systems. Punishment for installation will also be a fine of \$1500 and the business may lose its business privilege license.

DiCicco also called on residents to share their experiences with loud motorcycles by submitting their story in writing. Every letter or email he receives will be submitted at the public hearing.

"Woken up in the middle of the night. Car alarms set off. Babies startled. Frightened walking down the street. All of us have had an experience and its time we share those experiences," DiCicco stated. "Please write my office. Make your voice heard and maybe we can finally get these riders' attention."

AN ORDINANCE

Amending Title 12 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled "Traffic Code," by prohibiting the operation of a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle with certain types of aftermarket mufflers, and by prohibiting businesses and other persons from installing such prohibited types of aftermarket mufflers, and providing for fines and penalties; and amending Title 26 of The Philadelphia Code, entitled "Business Privilege Taxes," by providing for the revocation of the business privilege license of a business that violates the prohibition against the installation of certain prohibited mufflers; all under certain terms and conditions.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Title 12 of The Philadelphia Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

TITLE 12. TRAFFIC CODE

CHAPTER 12-1100. MISCELLANEOUS REGULATIONS AND PENALTIES.

§12-1129. Prohibited Exhaust Systems.

- (1) Definitions.
- (a) Aftermarket Muffler. An exhaust system that replaces the factory installed muffler.
- (b) Baffles. A removable hollow-core muffler system component that is designed to reduce exhaust noise.
- (c) Hollow-Core Muffler. A muffler where the exhaust inlet is visible from the exhaust outlet.
- (d) Straight-Pipe Exhaust Systems. An aftermarket motorcycle exhaust system that has the outward appearance of a uniform, consistent diameter the entire length of the system.
- (2) No individual shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle with a hollow-core muffler that is missing a baffle or straight-pipe exhaust system.
- (3) No individual shall install a straight-pipe exhaust system or a hollow-core muffler without a baffle or remove a baffle from any aftermarket muffler.

(2) Any person violating any of the provisions of Sections 12-1113(3), 12-1120, 12-1123, 12-1124, 12-1126, 12-1127(1), 12-1127(2), 12-1127(3) [and] 12-1128 and 12-1129 shall be liable for payment of fines, costs and additional fees prescribed and assessed in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 12-2800 of this Title.

(2) Any person violating the following provisions of Title 12 shall, upon a final finding of liability pursuant to this Chapter 12-2800, be liable for payment of the civil penalty indicated, in addition to the costs and fees set forth in subsection 12-2809(1):

SECTION 2. Chapter 19-2600 of The Philadelphia Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 19-2600. BUSINESS PRIVILEGE TAXES

* * *

§ 19-2602. Licenses.

* * *

(4) Every person required to procure a license under this Section shall as a condition to the receipt or retention of the license:

* * *

- (h) refrain from violating the provisions of Section 12-1129, relating to the installation of certain types of illegal mufflers.
- [(h)] (i) The Department of Licenses and Inspections is authorized to deny or revoke a business privilege license for failure to comply with the requirements of this subsection. Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked shall have the right to appeal to the Board of License and Inspection Review within ten (10) days after receipt of the notice of denial or revocation.
